




# Roadmap to NSECE Resources for Data Users

<p>A wide range of tutorials, user guides, and training resources are available to support researchers in using data from the National Survey of Early Care and Education (NSECE). These materials, published by ACF and hosted by the Child and Family Data Archive, are designed to help users work with the NSECE data to construct informative and accurate estimates. In addition to describing the basics of the design, the tutorials and resources cover topics such as incorporating geography into analyses, making comparisons across survey years and subgroups, understanding the sampling design, and applying statistical techniques. Because the 2012, 2019, and 2024 surveys share highly similar designs, most of the available resources are broadly relevant and applicable across all three rounds. This category includes resources that explain the overall design of the NSECE study, including its sampling strategy, survey questionnaires, and data collection methods. These resources can help users determine if NSECE data may be relevant to their research. They include survey sample-specific overview presentations, general overviews, and methodology overviews.</p>

This set of resources provides foundational guidance on navigating the NSECE data files. They explain the structure, content, and intended use of each file type—Quick Tabulation, Public Use, and Restricted Use—helping users understand what data is available and how to access it. These guides exist for each year of NSECE data collection.</p>

These written documents and videos focus on particular themes within the NSECE data, such as types of care, pricing, cost, or child age. There are also analytic products on topics that may interest researchers as a reference or to build on. These resources are valuable for understanding the logic behind the data and ensuring accurate interpretation of results.</p>

They often include programming examples and step-by-step guides for implementing complex research designs using NSECE data.</p>
